#### **News from Presbytery**

Clyde Presbytery has finally reached agreement on details for the proposed Presbytery Mission Plan. This Plan is part of a radical review being undertaken throughout the Church of Scotland with the intention of making the church more fit and able to function effectively and so fulfil its mission in our contemporary society. It is intended that the Plan will be valid for the next five years, and it is hoped that it can begin to be implemented after Presbytery's next meeting in June.

Earlier versions of the Plan had proposed that Westburn's sanctuary building be closed down and that we move towards a union with Lyle Kirk and St Margaret's and possibly also with Wellpark Midkirk. However it has been decided that Westburn's halls will be retained for the time being and that Lyle Kirk and St Margaret's will move towards union without us. Wellpark Midkirk will be linked with Hamilton Bardrainney. In other changes in our area, the two churches in Gourock will move towards union as will the two parishes in Kilmacolm and Inverkip will unite with Skelmorlie and Wemyss Bay.

It will of course be for each and every one of us in our own different ways to ensure that our church is a welcoming place with a meaningful and relevant message for all of our people.

In other news, Rev David Burt, minister at Old Gourock and Ashton linked with St Ninian's, has been nominated to serve as presbytery moderator for a year from September 2023.

# Saturday June 10<sup>th</sup> - Don't miss.....Da Capo Alba (Mandolin and Guitar Orchestra)

#### Music from the Movies



The church are delighted to be hosting a concert by 'Da Capo Alba', the Lanarkshire Mandolin & Guitar Orchestra, on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> June at 7pm. This is almost certainly the first performance ever by a guitar & mandolin orchestra in Greenock or Inverclyde. The orchestra has a unique sound, and the theme is 'Music from the Movies'.

Tickets are £10 (£8 concessions), and this includes refreshments at the interval.

This is a joint venture between the orchestra and the church, and any proceeds will be split equally between the two organisations, so please support the concert and come along for a very entertaining evening.

"Da Capo Alba" is the orchestral section of the Lanarkshire Guitar and Mandolin Association. For the past 20 years they have been entertaining

audiences throughout the UK (including two performances at Glasgow Royal Concert Hall) and abroad.

The concert will include music from Skyfall, Pirates of the Caribbean, Gladiator, Star Wars, Psycho, The Godfather, and much more including a Beatles medley.

Ian Pommerenke-Steel, the Lanarkshire Guitar & Mandolin Association's administrator and co-founder says, "Most people in Scotland have never heard a mandolin and guitar orchestra, but when they do they are pleasantly surprised by the sound of mandolins, mandolas, guitars and double bass, all of which complement each other in producing a unique orchestral sound.

We are absolutely delighted to be performing for the first time in Inverclyde... and we hope you will come along to our concert; I can promise that you that with 30 musicians on stage this will be a unique experience."

The orchestra has links with our church through Calum and Duncan Harbison, who have been involved in playing, conducting and arranging music for the orchestra for a number of years.
